

## College Campus Controlled Access Policy

As a private institution, it is the policy of Holy Cross College ("College") to reserve the right to control access to the campus based upon the mission of the College, the needs of the College community, the exigencies of any situation, and at the discretion of the College administration ("Administration") based upon reasonable expectations of privacy granted the College under the Constitutions of the United States of America and the State of Indiana.

Accordingly, the following are standing controls to access on campus:

- <u>Law Enforcement Arrest and Apprehension</u> The College does not allow law enforcement officers to make arrests and/or apprehend suspects on the campus except in exigent circumstances as permitted by state or federal law.
- Parking The College requires owners to register all vehicles parked on campus on a routine basis, overnight, or for an extended period. Vehicles on campus on a routine basis, overnight, or for an extended period not registered will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Restricted Individuals Holy Cross College maintains a *Persona non Grata* listing of all individuals who have been banned from access to campus on either temporary or permanent bases. This list is maintained by the Vice President of Student Affairs and is enforced at the discretion of the Administration.
- Weapons No weapons or ammunition are permitted on campus. Visitors who are lawfully carrying weapons as public officials, police officers, or legitimate security personnel must check in with Campus Security and be escorted during the entire period of their visit. No private party is permitted to carry weapons or ammunition on campus even if he/she has a valid carry permit.
- <u>Immigration</u> US Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") agents will only be permitted on campus for enforcement actions with proper warrants and will, as allowed by law, be escorted during the entire period he/she/they are on campus.

- Enforcement As Holy Cross Security Officers are not sworn law enforcement officers, they cannot and will not act on behalf of federal or state agents to enforce any laws. They may provide assistance as necessary to ensure the dignity and respect of all College campus community members.
- o Information The College protects all student records to the greatest possible extent and will only surrender such information when compelled to do so by a legitimate court order and with the advice of its Legal Counsel.

The College reserves the right to modify these controls as necessary, enact new or modified controls based upon the exigencies of any situation, all at the discretion of the Administration and advice of its Legal Counsel.
